

St. Eustatius 2017 - 2021



Road construction

A total of **4.1 kms** of roads has been constructed.

- The investments for Cherry Tree, Jeems Road, Smoke Alley, Mansion Road, White Hook and the roundabout amount to \$7.2 million.
- The construction of 14 other roads has already been scheduled, among which is the Airport Boulevard.





Reconstruction following hurricane Irma

- A sum of €43 million has been made available to St. Eustatius in the purview of reconstruction.
- A total of €10.4 million has been made available for the cliff wall near Fort Oranje.



Enhancement of liveability

- With effect from 1 January 2019, the **statutory minimum wage** has been **raised** by **7%**.
- Family allowances have been raised from \$42 in 2017 to \$87 in 2021.
- The Dutch Ministry of Social Affairs and Employment has allocated a structural sum of €9.8 million to the improvement of childcare facilities, which sum will be raised to €14 million in 2021.



Water purification

Currently, the annual production of clean drinking water totals 40,000 m³.

- Over the past year, three projects have been carried out to improve access to and the reliability of the drinking water supply: replacement and expansion of the main conveyor pipeline, expansion of the water storage capacity from 1.000 m³ to 4.000 m³, and expansion of the production capacity.
- Currently, 45% of the residents of St Eustatius are connected to the drinking water grid (850 connections). This represents an increase of 120 connections vis-à-vis last year.



Improvement of Internet connection Internet speed has become 20% faster.

- EUTEL BV has reduced its Internet rates by \$10 for its subscribers.
 This reduction will hold good for the next 5 years.
- The Ministry of Economic Affairs and Climate Policy has reduced the fixed connection charges for electricity users to \$0.
- Furthermore, a grant scheme has been introduced for the use of wired Internet with a monthly connection fee of \$25.



Non-specific allowances

 The non-specific allowance has increased from \$10,827,820 in 2017 to \$13,634,334 in 2020.
