Fully Vaccinated versus Non-Vaccinated

The Public Entity St. Eustatius hereby informs residents and incoming visitors on the criteria for being considered fully vaccinated and the criteria for being considered not (fully) vaccinated.

Please keep this in mind when travelling to St. Eustatius and prior to entering the island.

You are considered fully vaccinated, if you:

- had 2 shots of the vaccine where two shots are applicable (e.g. Moderna or Pfizer); the second shot <u>is</u>
 <u>not older</u> than 9 months or -
- had 2 shots of the vaccine where two shots are applicable (e.g. Moderna or Pfizer) plus the booster – or-
- had 1 shot of a vaccine where only 1 shot is applicable (e.g. the Johnson & Johnson vaccine). This shot is not older than 9 months.

If you are fully vaccinated, no monitoring or quarantine is required.

Not Vaccinated or not fully vaccinated

You are considered <u>not vaccinated or not fully vaccinated</u>, if you :

- Did not have any shots against the COVID-19 virus at all
 or -
- Had only 1 shot of a vaccine where two shots are applicable (e.g Moderna or Pfizer) – or -
- Had 2 shots of a vaccine where two shots are applicable (e.g Moderna or Pfizer) but the 2nd shot was given more than 9 months ago.

In one of these 3 cases, you will need to go into quarantine for seven (7) days. An exit test is required on the 7^{th} day.

Did you have COVID-19 before? In this case, a Recovery Letter is required!

Individuals who have contracted the virus before, will be subjected to submit **proof** in the form of a **letter of recovery** from the health care provider or their Public Health Department under which jurisdiction they were infected.

The Recovery Letter should be dated at least 11 days after proof of infection and a negative PCR or Antigen test is required.

In this case, the five (5) days monitoring protocol is applicable. An exit test is required on the 5th day.
